BCSIS Stream A and B: Overview and Referrals

BCSIS Stream A

Settlement, employment, community connections, and language services open to all BC-eligible clients, including refugee claimants.

BCSIS Stream A (General services) provides information and support services that assist the refugee claimant with settlement and labour market entry. A client may be referred to a Stream B service if they need more intensive supports to access shelter, legal aid and mental health/trauma counseling during the initial claim process. Stream A service provider should assist refugee claimants through a warm referral to Stream B specialized services offered by ISSofBC in the Lower Mainland and MOSAIC and its partners in the Fraser Valley and Surrey.

Stream B

Pre-settlement and employment, services, and capacity building specific to refugee claimants.

Trauma support and counselling for all refugee groups.

Stream B (Specialized services) provides a wraparound support service that assists the refugee claimant during their initial settlement and claim process. A Stream B wraparound service may include help with documentation, access to food and shelter, medical care, clinical counseling and mental health group support, legal aid, familiarization with the hearing process, work permit and customized employment support. Once the claimant is settled into more permanent housing and has filed a claim, the Stream B service provider will then ensure that the client is connected to the community where they have settled into through a referral to a BCSIS Stream A worker in that community or another stakeholder where appropriate.



- VAST supports refugee mental health through counselling, documentation, education, and referrals. VAST provides mental health supports related to the stresses, anxieties, and challenges of the job searching and training process with a trauma informed approach. VAST also provides capacity building training for the refugee and refugee serving sector related to mental health, trauma-informed practice, and torture rehabilitation






